

Tips for multiple-choice tests



- ✓ Write your name and class details clearly in the space provided.
- ✓ Make sure you have two sharp HB or 2B pencils (in case one breaks) and an eraser (in case you mark the wrong bubble by mistake).
- ✓ Read all of the instructions and read each question twice so you know exactly what is being asked of you.
- ✓ Try to answer the question without looking at the choices, then read through the choices. Doing this allows you to make a clearer decision.
- ✓ Start at Question 1 but skip any questions that seem too hard and come back to them at the end. Otherwise you might run out of time if you spend too long on a question you find difficult.
- ✓ Never leave a multiple-choice question unanswered. Even if you just guess the answer — you might be right!
- ✓ Don't be put off by an answer that seems too obvious or too simple.
- ✓ Do not change an answer unless you know that your answer is wrong.
- ✓ If you find a question difficult, look at the answers given for the question. Are there any answers that you know are completely wrong? You may only have two choices now and this will give you a better chance of choosing the correct answer.
